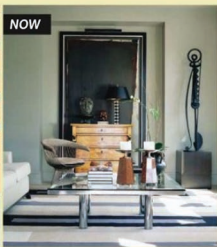
The Idealist DOUGLAS CRIDLAND

Cridland has been a fixture on the western — and national — design scene since 1975. With a signature muddy palette, he's known for moving house and shifting his polished style on the modern-to-traditional spectrum. "I'm intrigued by the process: why a room works, what makes it a successful space," he told us in 2005, when we featured his sleek penthouse. "It helps me stay current."

MAZEN EL-ABDALLAH

Mazen Studio, Toronto

NAM DANG-MITCHELL

Classical rooms in quiet neutrals have an edgy glamour in the hands of Calgary's Dang-Mitchell. Shining gold, silver and polished-nickel surfaces play against rustic motifs and industrial accents; tailored silhouettes and architectural panelling bring gravitas to pretty tufted upholstery and demure damask prints. In January, H&H will showcase Dang-Mitchell's own trendsetting home as a prototype for comfortable yet glamorous design.

BARBARA PURDY

Luxe looks on a budget and grand spaces that feel inviting are effortless when executed by this talented designer and her partner, Olivia Botrie. A former neurosurgical nurse, Purdy moved into design and quickly gained notice as a senior designer on HGTV's Home to Stay. She appeared in H&H in 2008, then landed the cover three years later with the light-filled redo of a one-day basement. Next month, look for the elegantly cosy interiors she imagined for a stately stone home in Calgary.

Designer Ouellette (left) and architect Vandal specialize in interiors that cater to the lives lived within them. Partners in life and work, they co-founded their Montreal design-build firm in 2003.
